Transplant Project Goals 2022-2023

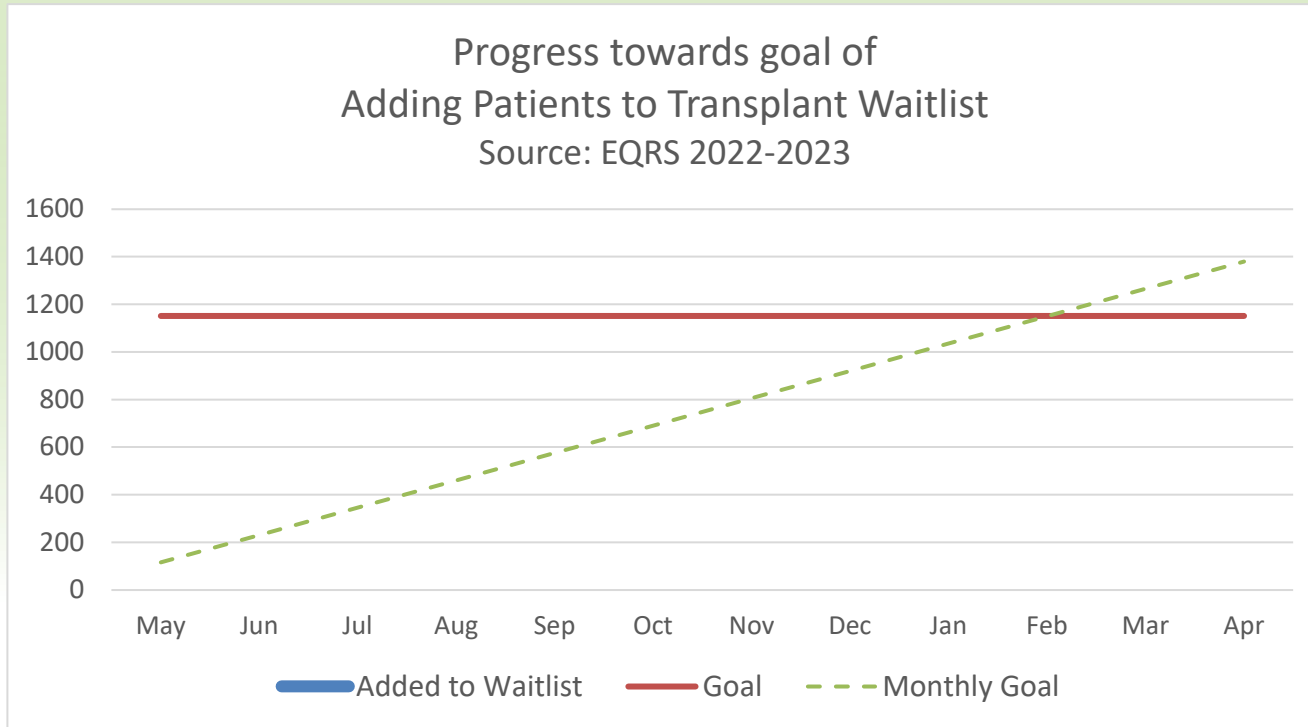
Goals

- Achieve an additional 4% increase in the number of patients receiving a kidney transplant for a 6% total increase from the baseline to the end of Option Period 1.(April 2023)

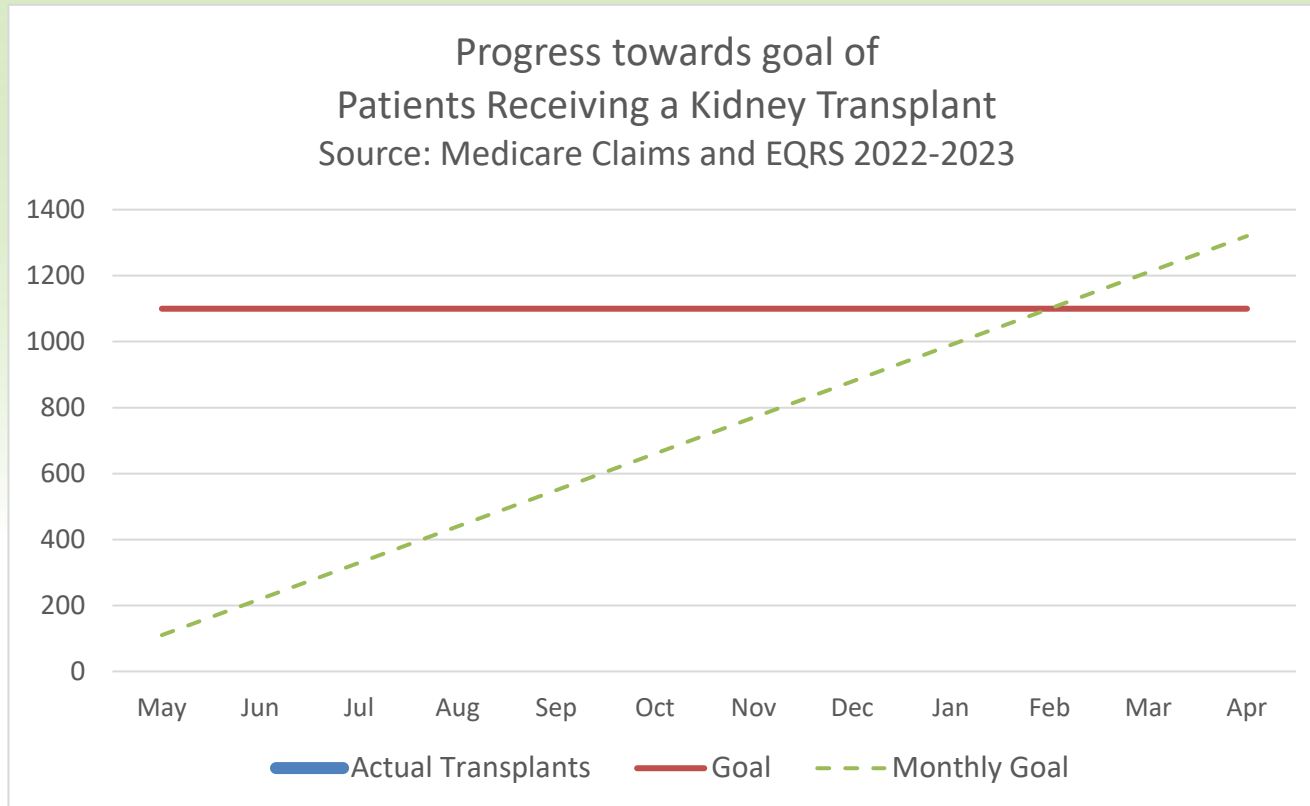
Goals

- Achieve an additional 3% increase in the number of patients added to a kidney transplant waiting list for a 5% total increase from the baseline to the end of Option Period 1. (April 2023)

The goal for the MKN Region for patients added to the kidney transplant waitlist is approximately 100 patients or greater per month (May 2022-April 2023)



The Goal for Patients receiving a kidney transplant in the MKN Region is approximately 95 patients or greater per month



Strategies

- Utilizing the Transplant Change Package as a foundation for improvement
- Sharing resources from a variety of organizations and subject matter experts
- Incorporating the patient voice through patient subject matter experts in the advisory group and on project specific topics

Strategies

- Transplant advisory coalition to shape and drive project strategies
- Identifying best practices through high performing facilities and sharing with all facilities in Network region
- Data driven analysis with strategic implementation through technical assistance
- Focusing on Equity in healthcare and transplantation working with both provider & patient subject matter experts and utilizing community and ESRD NCC resources.
